Western Apache Heritage Jun 24 2019 Mention "Apaches," and many Anglo-Americans picture the "marauding savages" of western movies or impoverished reservations beset by a host of social problems. But, like most stereotypes, these images distort the complex history and rich cultural heritage of the Apachean peoples, who include the Navajo, as well as the Western, Chiricahua, Mescalero, Jicarilla, Lipan, and Kiowa Apaches. In this pioneering study, Richard Perry synthesizes the findings of anthropology, ethnology, linguistics, archaeology, and ethnohistory to reconstruct the Apachean past and offer a fuller understanding of the forces that have shaped modern Apache culture. While scholars generally agree that the Apacheans are part of a larger group of Athapaskan-speaking peoples who originated in the western Subarctic, there are few archaeological remains to prove when, where, and why those northern cold dwellers migrated to the hot deserts of the American Southwest. Using an innovative method of ethnographic reconstruction, however, Perry hypothesizes that these nomadic hunters were highly adaptable and used to exploiting the resources of a wide range of mountainous habitats. When changes in their surroundings forced the ancient Apacheans to expand their food quest, it was natural for them to migrate down the "mountain corridor" formed by the Rocky Mountain chain. This reconstruction of Apachean history and culture sheds much light on the origins, dispersions, and relationships of Apache groups. Perry is the first researcher to attempt such an extensive reconstruction, and his study is the first to deal with the full range of Athapaskan-speaking peoples. His method will be instructive to students of other cultures who face a similar lack of historical and archaeological data.

Dilly Nov 21 2021 The highly eccentric Alfred Dillwyn Knox, known simply as 'Dilly', was one of the leading figures in the British codebreaking successes of the two world wars. During the first, he was the chief codebreaker in the Admiralty, breaking the German Navy's main flag code, before going on to crack the German Enigma ciphers during the Second World War at Bletchley Park. Here, he enjoyed the triumphant culmination of his life's work: a reconstruction of the Enigma machine used by the Abwehr, the German Secret Service. This kept the British fully aware of what the German commanders knew about Allied plans, allowing MI5 and MI6 to use captured German spies to feed false information back to the Nazi spymasters. Mavis Batey was one of 'Dilly's girls', the young female codebreakers who helped him to break the various Enigma ciphers. She was called upon to advise Kate Winslet, star of the film Enigma, on what it was like to be one of the few female codebreakers at Bletchley Park. This gripping new edition of Batey's critically acclaimed book reveals the vital part Dilly played in the deception operation that ensured the success of the D-Day landings, altering the course of the Second World War.

He was born between Thun and Berne in the canton of Berne. Descendants lived in Pennsylvania, Ohio, and elsewhere. Hans Andreas Riem (1642-1719) was born in Leimen, Germany. His descendants Johann Eberhard Ream (1687-1779) was born in Leiman, Germany. He married Anna Elisabeth Schwab (1692-1761). They immigrated to Pennsylvania ca. 1717-1718. Johann David Clem or Klemm immigrated to Pennsylvania in 1747 and later settled in Powell's Fort Valley, Virginia. He died in 1789. Christian Grove (died 1786) married (1) Ann Rodes and (2) Esther Musselman and lived in Shenandoah County, Virginia. Includes family of his brother, Marks Grove (died 1808). John Denniston (died 1853) was born in Pennsylvania. He lived in New Bethlehem and married Mary Millison (1809-1868). Some of his family then settled in Missouri. Also includes the family of Heinrich and Barbara Lerch Leinbach who lived in Langenselbold, Prussia, Germany.
