In teams of two the students had to design a segment of a whole collaborative Labyrinth. During the fall semester the segment was developed and represented through two- and three-dimensional hand drawings and handmade sketch and presentation models. In the following summer semester the students further developed their segments in a digital 3D-model, laser model and renderings.
